StudentAid.gov is FSA's informational website for students, parents, and borrowers. 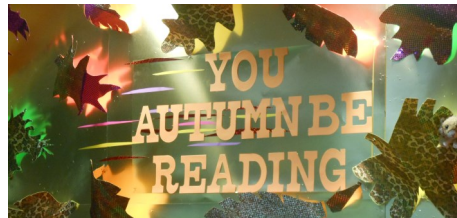
