Neighborhoods

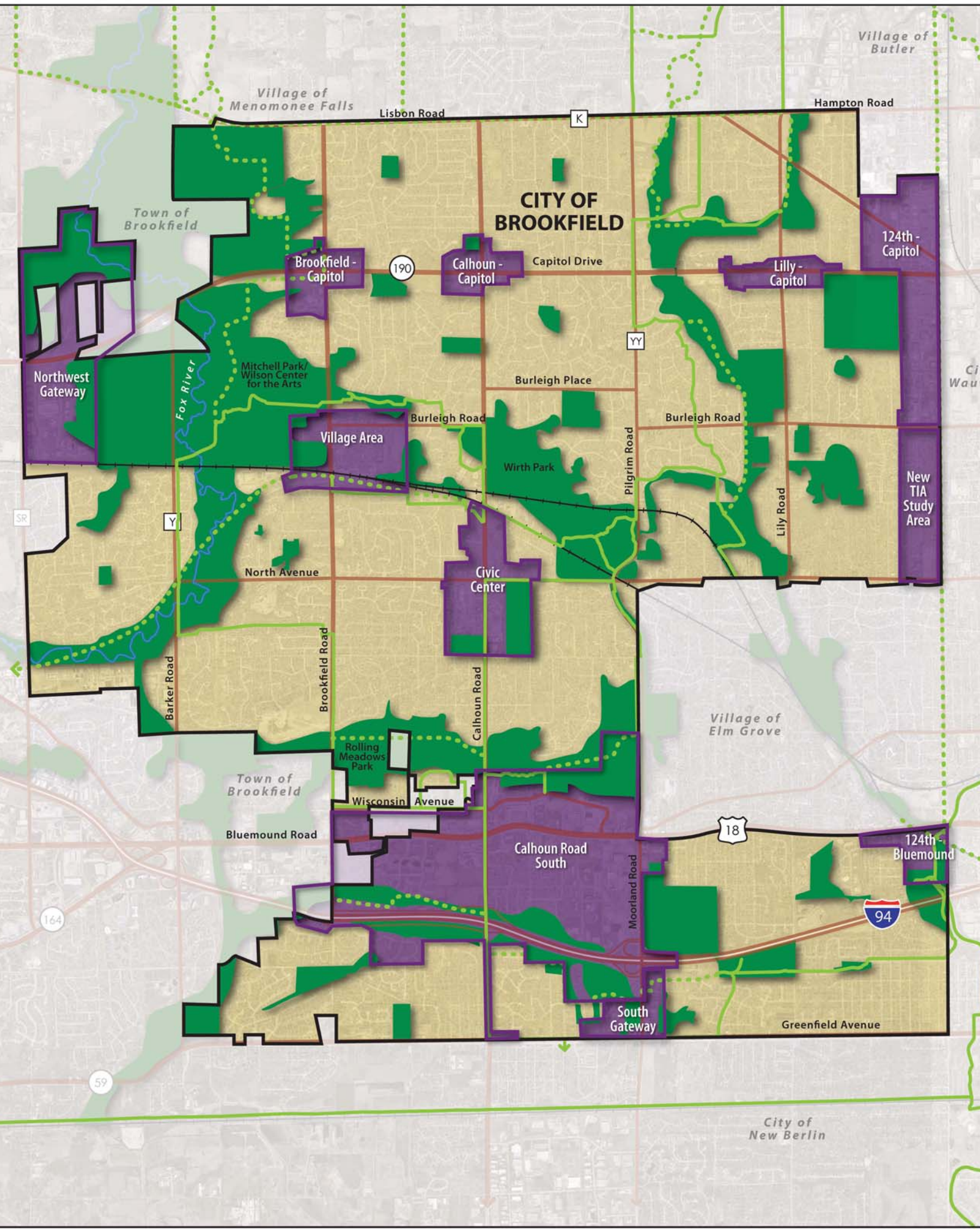
- Priority on preserving a safe and comfortable living environment
- Very limited land use change
- Traffic control and public safety emphasized
- Reinvestment in older neighborhoods
- Improved bicycle/pedestrian connections to parks, schools, shopping, and jobs

Greenways

- Completed trail network providing community connections
- Interconnected open spaces for recreation and flood management
- Contributors to Brookfield's "garden city" character
- Increased role for Mitchell Park as activity center
- Linkages to regional open spaces and trails

Targeted Investment Areas

- Places which foster community reinvention, responding to evolving markets and community demands
- Areas for new economic development and tax base growth
- Targeted locations for sustainable, mixed use redevelopment
- Sensitivity to surrounding neighborhoods when development occurs
- Contributors to Brookfield's unique identity and experience
